

Restricting the access of vulnerable persons to gambling

Significant self-constraint statement

The player can sign a self-constraint statement covering one or more types of gambling or organizer (hereinafter referred to as: significant self-constraint statement).

Submission and validity of the significant self-constraint statement:

A significant self-constraining statement must be given in person, in written form, with the proof of the person's identity, at the designated customer service of the Gambling Supervisory Authority or submitted by mail to the Gambling Supervisory Authority in form of a fully conclusive private document.

The significant self-constraint statement may define the legal Gambling Supervisory Authority as well.

The validity period of the significant self-constraint statement:

- 1 year,
- 3 years,
- 5 years.

A declaration with a validity period not exceeding 1 year cannot be revoked.

Any declaration of a validity of more than one year may be revoked after the expiration of at least two years, together with the proof of identity at the Gambling Supervisory Authority's customer service, in a person, in form of a written statement.

The personal identification data of the person making the declaration of a significant self-constraint statement, shall be registered by the Gambling Supervisory Authority in the player protection registry.

Restrictions based on court decision:

A person must not participate in gambling if he is placed by a court statement under the care of a guardian, because of a full or a partial restriction of said person's capacity, due to gambling addiction or dependency.

The personal identification data of persons under the restriction of the Gambling Supervisory Authority shall be registered in the player protection registry.
